I am extremely appreciative of our students, parents and carers, teachers, staff and administrators for their positivity, flexibility and resilience. Term 2 is going to challenge our school as we manage a high number of positive cases amongst students, staff and parents and carers. NAPLAN

2022 NAPLAN testing for Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students has been extended for another week, to ensure students who have been absent have the opportunity to complete NAPLAN. The purpose of the National Assessment Program is to provide information to schools and teachers enabling them to drill deeply into their data to identify strengths and gaps in overall performance. This information is used to establish and implement plans and strategies focused on improvement. As an example of this, our current Business Plan, Your Child: Our Focus was developed with the support of longitudinal NAPLAN data.

Parents and carers are reminded that the most accurate and reliable information regarding their child/ren's performance comes from the classroom teacher. They are constantly assessing to ensure every child gets what they need, at the right time. With Semester 1 Reports to be released in Week 10 of this term, parents and carers are encouraged to make the time to meet with the classroom and specialist teachers to discuss the progress and achievement of their child/ren.

Connect

One benefit that has come out of COVID 19, has been the shift to online learning platforms. We actively use Connect and ask everyone to keep an eye on it. Connect allows parents and carers to see what their child is working on in class, so they can assist them or keep them on track. On completion of an assignment, teachers upload the students respective mark onto Connect. These can be seen by students, parents and carers, and used to track progress and achievement across the year. If you need any assistance with Connect, please contact the front office.

NAPLAN

The start of this term saw our Year 7 and 9 students participating in NAPLAN. It is a test of the skills that are deemed essential for every child to progress through school. Students are tested in reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation and numeracy. Those Year 9 students who attain Band 8 or higher in all the tests, will be considered as pregualified for OLNA and as such will not be required to sit it later in their schooling.

ANZAC Ceremony

On the first day for students and staff participated in a virtual ANZAC ceremony to honour those who have given their lives in the service of their country. Congratulations to Mr Robertson, Mr Duncan and the Youth Emergency Services Team led by Khloe Watson in compiling editing and producing the service.

We believe ANZAC Day is important as it commemorates those military personnel who died in war. Anzac Day originally commemorated the Australian and New Zealand forces that landed on the Gallipoli Peninsula in Turkey on 25 April 1915 during the First World War. They were part of the allied mission to capture Constantinople (now Istanbul), which was the capital of one of Germany's major allies, the Ottoman Empire.


