#### PARENT and CARER INFORMATION

Voluntary contributions, compulsory charges and approved funding paid by parents and carers are used to purchase text books, materials and other resources used by students in their everyday classes. Outlined below are the contributions and charges for Donnybrook District High School in 2018. All contributions and charges assist in providing an educational program that meets the requirements of the School Curriculum and Standards Authority and comply with the guidelines issued by the Department of Education and the *School Education Act 1999 and Regulations*. The school community is very appreciative of the financial support given by parents and carers which enables staff to continue to offer quality educational programs.

This information is provided so that all parents and carers are clearly informed of the school's contributions and charges structure. The Donnybrook District High School Board endorses these contributions and charges on an annual basis and every effort is made to keep the cost to parents and carers low. Financial assistance is available to eligible parents and carers of Year 7-10 students through the Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS).

For more information, please refer to Item 6. In addition to this general information booklet, individual tax invoices are sent home at the beginning of each school year and if necessary throughout the school year as timely reminders.

#### 1. VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

The school is requesting a voluntary contribution of \$60 for each Kindergarten to Year 6 student and \$235 for each Year 7 to 10 student. This voluntary contribution goes towards all consumables and resources used across the learning areas, as well as the options and electives offered to all students. These contributions will make a significant difference to the quality of the educational program that the school can deliver and parents and carers are urged to support the school.

In addition to the voluntary contribution, the school is requesting all parents and carers contribute \$15 for printing costs for each child enrolled at Donnybrook District High School. These will partly offset the high costs associated with photocopying and printing.

#### 2. COMPULSORY CHARGES

**Recreation Centre Charge of \$36 for Years 7 - 10 students.** The school has organised with the Shire to establish a standard charge at a significantly discounted rate for use of the Recreation Centre during the school year. This enables the Secondary School to run various Physical Education and Recreational Sport programs that enhance your child's learning. The Donnybrook – Balingup Shire Council set this fee when they do their annual budget.

#### 3. OPTIONAL COSTS

**Extra Cost Optional Activities.** Charges apply for the provision of extra optional activities that are part of an education program, and, which 'contributions' do not cover. These extra optional activities and their costs are communicated prior to the activity taking place. If you wish your child not to participate, an alternative educational program will be provided.

#### 4. OTHER COSTS

These comprise of the school's annual magazine the 'Gilliana' at a cost of \$20 and also a Parents and Citizens Association (P&C) donation of \$25 which parents/carers may choose to support if they wish. Collection of this donation is directed back into the school by the P&C and is used to purchase resources and equipment in areas of particular need. Your participation in the P&C is welcome and we invite you to attend any of the P&C meetings and bring forward ideas and suggestions for the benefit of all our students.

#### 5. PERSONAL ITEMS

**Personal Items** are items that students need to own and have on a daily basis, such as, stationery, calculators, safety glasses, etc... Whilst the P&C distributes Personal Items Lists annually through our local newsagency as a fundraiser, parents and carers are able to purchase from any supplier.

#### 6. GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE - SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME (SAS)

The Western Australian Government provides an allowance to assist eligible families. The allowance consists of two components:

- 1. \$115 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/carer or the school; and
- 2. \$235 Educational Program Allowance paid directly to the school and is taken as payment for the Voluntary Contribution.

To be eligible for SAS, parents/carers must hold one of the following cards:

- Pensioner Concession Card (from Centrelink);
- Health Care Card (from Centrelink); or a
- Pensioner Concession Card from the Department of Veterans' Affairs

Cards held must be current in Term 1. Applications must be made in person and forms are available from the Administration Office at the Secondary Campus. Applications close at the end of Term 1 and any application received after this period will not be accepted. Information is available from Centrelink regarding other allowances such as:

**Youth Allowance:** This allowance applies to students 16 years and over and is to assist with students' educational requirements.

**Abstudy:** This allowance applies to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students to assist with their educational requirements.

#### 7. PAYMENT OF CONTRIBUTIONS, CHARGES AND FEES

We request that ALL contributions, charges and fees are paid in full before the end of Term 1.

#### How and when:

Payments can be made at any time between 8:00am and 4:00pm, Monday-Friday at either the Junior or Senior Campus Administration Offices during the school terms in person, over the phone or by mail. You may choose to pay by cash, cheque or credit card. Credit card payments can also be made directly to the school's bank account online:
