PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - James Milne

Welcome back to the second half of the 2018 school year. I hope the students managed to have a relaxing and enjoyable break, and are ready for a productive Semester 2. During Terms 3 and 4, teachers will be focussing on essential elements of the Western Australian Curriculum to prepare students for 2019. Whilst they will be narrowing the focus to target specific areas of need, there is still a large amount to cover that will keep the students engaged and busy. To further support this, the teachers will increase their focus on ensuring the learning intentions are made clear to students prior to lessons and programs of work.

The students should have taken the time to reflect on their Semester 1 Reports and overall progress throughout Terms 1 and 2. I would like to see the students setting themselves a number of personal goals to strive to achieve to support their schooling and set themselves up for the following year.

I would urge parents and carers to please take the time to meet with the teachers if an interview was requested on the reports by classroom or learning area teachers. If an interview wasn't requested, you are still more than welcome to meet with teachers to clarify any issues or concerns you may have.

This term is shaping up to be exciting. A Term 3 calendar accompanies today's newsletter and highlights the many wonderful opportunities being offered to the students of Donnybrook District High School. Further opportunities are also being planned and these will be added to the calendar as the term progresses.

Staffing

Our new Associate Principal, Renee Reid has stepped magnificently into the role she has been entrusted to fill. I have been impressed with the manner in which Renee is leading the Senior Campus, and I am confident her influence is going to be extremely positive. Renee has commenced work on a number of key areas and I am already seeing the impact of her secondary knowledge and experience taking effect.

Welcome to Jamie Turnbull who has filled the Secondary Horticulture/Agriculture and Primary Kitchen Garden roles vacated by Rachel Seton at the end of Term 2. This wasn't a position I anticipated needing to fill, but was tasked with this challenge over the school holiday period. Jamie lives locally and has a strong teaching background, having worked in both Primary and Secondary schools throughout his career.

Michelle Daniels has been appointed as an Education Assistant for Semester 2, filling the void left by the retirement of Peta Murphy. Waiane Jacobs continues in her role as an Education assistant in the Pre-Primary for the remainder of 2018. These positions will be advertised to be filled permanently once cleared by the Department of Education.

2019 Structure and Programs

Planning for next year will commence shortly with changes being considered to address areas of needs. The quest to meet the needs of our school community continues and leading this will be Renee and myself, together with our School Board. If you would like to meet with Renee or I to discuss 2019, you are more than welcome to call and arrange a mutually convenient time. I also ask that you please notify the school if your child/ren won't be attending Donnybrook District



High School next year as this will support our planning. This is crucial in our current educational environment whereby the school is funded through a Student Centred Funding Model which entails a \$ amount per student enrolled.

Voluntary Contributions

As we enter the second half of the 2018 school year I will be arranging for statements to be sent home asking parents and carers to pay their outstanding voluntary contributions and/or charges.

Donnybrook District High School relies on parents and carers to contribute towards their child's schooling to be able to continue to offer the opportunities that are being presented to the students from Kindergarten to Year 10. As part of our financial planning each year we budget to receive voluntary contributions together with all outstanding charges. With these funds, we are able to deliver the programs and supply the resources that ensure the students of our community are provided with an array of opportunities during their schooling at Donnybrook District High School.

In 2018 we have once again invested significantly in resourcing our highly successful Year 5 and 6 Options Program and the Year 9 and 10 Certificate Courses. We continue to improve and upgrade our Information and Communication Technology equipment to support the successful delivery of the new Digital Technologies curriculum. Many parents and carers will be aware of the extension and remediation programs that are operating on both the Junior and Senior Campus to meet the needs of all our students. The Human and Physical Resources to implement these programs come at a significant cost and I hope parents and carers appreciate this and are in a position to assist the students and staff. What we are delivering is unique (no other K-10 school does what we do) and it is certainly having a positive impact on student learning and engagement.

Kindergarten Enrolments

Donnybrook District High School, like all Public Schools, has been taking enrolments for Kindergarten in 2019. The Department of Education is encouraging all parents and carers to enrol as early as possible to secure a placement. Enrolments are for children turning four by 30 June 2019. When enrolling, parents and carers need to bring their child's birth certificate, immunisation records and proof of current address.

To support our planning for 2019, parents and carers are encouraged to enroll their child this term. Placement in classes will be based on enrolment dates, with preference given to parents and cares based on when their child's enrolment form has been completed and accepted.

Thank you for my very warm welcome from staff, students and parents to this wonderful school. The catchphrase that I have heard most in my first two weeks is that, "It's a great school" and as I have been greeted so warmly by so many students around the school, I think it is absolutely true. I started my career working in a district high school at Jerramungup and my second posting was at a district high too, but at the opposite end of the state – Kununurra – so I'm happy to be back working in a small community based school . Prior to my move here, I was in charge of a large department at Esperance Senior High School (with about the same number of staff there that is in the whole high school here).

A bit of back ground about me: I've moved to the South West with my husband Stephen and my two daughters, Ellie (Year 9) and Holly (Year 7). As my husband will be working in Bunbury, we are living there and the girls are attending school there. My teaching background is in English and Drama so I'm hoping that I can provide some assistance to our literacy teachers and you might even see me pop up in the odd theatre production or two. I don't mind a bit of singing (though YOU may mind when you hear me) and I love the beach, cooking (and, of course, eating) and travelling. Last year, we took a whole term off on long service leave and travelled Europe as a family.

I am a passionate educator and one of my goals at Donnybrook DHS is to ensure that every student achieves at their very best and each individual is thoroughly prepared for whatever their next step will be when they leave this school. Students come in all sizes, shapes and abilities and we need to differentiate our teaching to suit them. Please feel free to make an appointment to come and meet me to discuss the individual needs of your child. You know your child better than anyone so I welcome your input into their education.

Congratulations to our students who were selected for the Cross Country Interschool event. On July 31st, Ms Duncan is taking a group of 15 students to Bunbury to compete in this challenging event where students run through a forest trail safely navigating natural obstacles. Good luck to all of those involved!



The Year 9s and 10s will be attending valuable First Aid courses where they will learn about the impact of texting and driving and will attend a crash simulation and see how it's dealt with. I'm sure they will get a lot out of this and thanks to Mr Davis for organising this.

They are so lucky to have this opportunity and I know that the War Memorial visit, in particular, is one that they will probably never forget. I'm really appreciative of the staff and parents giving up their time to allow students to have this experience and I'm looking forward to Mr Robertson's blog and photos.

There was a huge turnout at Joel's funeral on Friday. This showed just how much of a positive impact Joel had on all of us. He will be very fondly remembered as a kind, sporty and genuine young man.

The Year 10s went to a road safety performance to prevent road trauma from texting on Friday at the Bunbury Entertainment Centre. St John Ambulance and Manea Senior College put on an excellent performance re-enacting a car versus car on stage. Former students from Donnybrook DHS participated as the first aiders on stage. All students rated the performance highly.

Donnybrook District High School – Junior Campus - Waste Audit – 23rd July 2018

Since our last visit in November 2017 the School has made some great improvements with the creation of the Green Team and the introduction of the organics and recycling bins around the school. The new bin system not only teaches the kids that they can play a big part in making a difference; they have also helped to divert waste away from landfill and stopped the creation of some nasty landfill gases such as methane.



With the new organics bins (scrap bins) a HUGE 1.9kg (in only one day) of organic material was collected and used within the school for their own compost and chickens. This would equal 95kg of organic waste per term or 380kg of organic waste diverted away from landfill each year.


This years audit showed a few interesting results including 61% of all the waste audited was still food scraps, which could have been collected for the school scraps bucket. An additional 14% was fruit and veg scraps or whole fruit which can also be sent to the schools compost bins. The schools new recycling bins could be better utilised with plastic containers, cans and cartons found in the waste audit.

Thank you to the Year 4's and Green Team for hosting the Waste Education Officers and undertaking the waste audit with us, keep up the great work!

Fortnite: Battle Royale is a survival game where 100 players fight against each other to be the last one standing. Each player is allocated an avatar and they can select to play solo, duo or as a squad (where they can add friends and play as a team). Players skydive out of a 'battle bus' onto a small island, armed with a pickaxe, and must hunt for more weapons and equipment whilst avoiding an electrical storm. While the axe is used to attack and defend, it can also be used to gather building materials to make various structures. As players are eliminated, the field of play shrinks, forcing players into combat. Strategic thinking is necessary for survival.
