PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - James Milne

Welcome back to the start of a new school year and one that will see the staff continue to concentrate their efforts on the key areas outlined within the school's Business Plan. We have entered the final year of this three year plan and have successfully achieved a number of significant milestones, but recognise there is substantial work to do in relation to our priorities and the embedding of approaches. I am looking forward to working closely with students, staff, parents and carers and the School Board to address our priorities of Student Focused Learning, Behaviour and Wellbeing and School Community Collaboration.



I am genuinely excited about the 2019 school year and what lies ahead for our school community. The decisions that were made late last year and the changes that have been put in place will take some adjusting to, but will undoubtedly be positive for the students we are entrusted to teach. You will be pleased to note that staff have returned refreshed and committed to what lies ahead and I feel very fortunate to have their support.

I would like to welcome Mandy Thompson to Donnybrook District High School for Term 1. Mandy has been appointed to teach in tandem with Oonagh Smith in the Year 4/5 class on a Thursday and Friday.

I would also like to welcome Pak (Sir) Nata. Nata has been employed as an Indonesian Language Assistant to support Iswari on a Wednesday. This is a wonderful addition to the program and will enhance the learning taking place in Indonesian classes.

It is pleasing to report that the students have returned from their Summer break, ready to commit to their learning and gain the most from the programs in place. All Kindergarten to Year 10 students have made a pleasing start and are to be congratulated for their effort throughout the first two weeks. I look forward to seeing this continue throughout the remainder of the term.

On behalf of the Donnybrook School Community I would like to welcome our new students and families and wish them the very best for the 2019 school year. I'm confident they will settle in well to their new school and be made to feel very welcomed by the school community.

Teachers from the Junior Campus will be holding parent meetings in these initial weeks. These will provide parents with a perfect opportunity to gain more of an insight into the year ahead and clarify any queries they may have surrounding their child's schooling.

Secondary teachers plan on holding parent meetings on the afternoon of Wednesday 20 March. Parents and carers will be able to make appointments to meet with teachers closer to this date. In the mean time I urge you all to stay in touch with the Secondary teachers via Connect.

I ask that you all work closely with the teachers throughout the year and if you have any concerns over your child's education, then take the time to discuss these with the teachers at your earliest convenience. Alternatively you may contact either myself or Renee Reid. It is important that we work together to ensure the year is positive for everyone.

Positive Behaviour Support

Over the past three years Donnybrook District High School has embarked on a Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) journey that has focussed our efforts on establishing a learning environment where everyone feels included, connected, safe and respected. It is pleasing to report that this approach has had a significant impact on both the Junior Campus and Senior Campus.

To complement the school's PBS approach, this year the school will be developing and implementing a whole school approach to enhancing student mental health and wellbeing. A key Primary and Secondary teacher will work on putting structures and programs in place that address this need. Student wellbeing has a substantial impact on learning outcomes and importantly this initiative will add value to our PBS program.

Violence In Schools

Towards the end of 2018 the State Government put plans and policies in place to reduce violence in schools. The Minister of Education, in collaboration with the Department of Education is taking a stand to address the unfortunate attitude of a minority of students who choose to intentionally attack other students or seek to instigate fights. Students who create unsafe situations for their peers will face automatic suspension for a period deemed appropriate by myself or Renee Reid. These students will also be excluded from any extra curricula activities such as excursions and school social activities.

Parents and carers expect that when their child attends school they will be safe, nurturing and supportive environment. Thankfully Donnybrook District High School provides this setting, but in the event that the good order of school life is disrupted, students and parents and carers can expect this plan to be enacted by the leadership team.

The response to violent behaviour is a shared responsibility between schools and their communities and I look forward to your support in relation to this issue. Further discussion on this will take place at School Board.

Farewell

In a couple of weeks we will say farewell and thank you to Esme Kidd. Esme has been our Teacher Librarian for 6 years, successfully managing the Community Library on behalf of the school and the Shire. In addition to this, she has supported the literacy development of our Secondary students through engaging and relevant programs. Esme will be dearly missed by students and staff with her professional and caring approach being hard to replace. The Teacher Librarian position is currently being advertised and will be filled in the near future. On behalf of the school community I wish Esme the very best for this next chapter in her life.

Once assessments have been conducted, the Marksbook section will let you see your child's mark, as well as the overall class average. You can contact your child's teacher via Connect and there is an app you can download on your phone for easy access. In Week 7 (on Wednesday March 20), we will have a parent afternoon/evening where you can learn more about Connect, whilst meeting with teachers to discuss your child's progress. A booking site will be set up and we will email you details via Connect closer to the time.

Uniform

Remember that we don't have black as our uniform. Form teachers have been recording when students aren't wearing uniform and you may have received a call or letter about this. The Secondary Assistance Scheme is available to parents or independent secondary students who hold eligible concession cards. It comprises an Education Program Allowance which is paid to the school, and a Clothing Allowance that can be paid to the school or the parent. Forms are available at the front office. 


Junior Campus News


