### 2020 Structure and Programs

As per Department of Education expectations, planning for next year will commence mid-way through this term. During this period, Renee and I will be working closely with the School Board to ensure our plans are meeting the needs of our school community and invite parents and carers to engage in this overall process. If you would like to meet with Renee or I to discuss 2020, you are more than welcome to call and arrange a mutually convenient time.

To support our planning I ask that you please notify the school if your child/ren won't be attending Donnybrook District High School next year. This information is crucial in our current educational environment whereby the school is funded through a Student Centred Funding Model which entails a \$ amount per student enrolled.

### Voluntary Contributions

As we enter the second half of the 2019 school year, I will be arranging for statements to be sent home asking parents and carers to pay their outstanding voluntary contributions and/or charges.

Donnybrook District High School relies on parents and carers to contribute towards their child's schooling to be able to continue to offer the opportunities that are being presented to the students from Kindergarten to Year 10. As part of our financial planning each year we budget to receive voluntary contributions together with all outstanding charges. With these funds, we are able to deliver the programs and supply the resources that ensure the students of our community are provided with an array of opportunities during their schooling at Donnybrook District High School.

What we deliver at Donnybrook District High School is unique (no other K-10 school has the capacity to do what we do) and we are not only looking to sustain this, but importantly build on it in the years to come.

### Kindergarten Enrolments

Donnybrook District High School, like all Public Schools, are currently taking enrolments for Kindergarten in 2020. Enrolments are for children turning four by 30 June 2020.

To support our planning for 2020, parents and carers are encouraged to enroll their child this term. Placement in classes will be based on enrolment dates, with preference given to parents and carers based on when their child's enrolment form has been completed and accepted. When enrolling, parents and carers need to bring their child's birth certificate, immunisation records and proof of current address.

At this point in the year we have filled one Kindergarten class, which is exciting, and we are now looking to extend our program to a second class.

Our Year 9 and 10 students have been completing their exams this week. The exams are based around work that has been completed in Semester 1 and revised since the start of this term. The exams provide opportunity for practice as a lead-in to Senior Schooling and the exams start to replicate the style of exam students will get in Year 11 and 12 (whether it be an ATAR or a General pathway that they follow).

The exams also give us a good picture of what has been learnt over the course of Semester 1 and this helps inform our planning for Semester 2.

### Sideeffect Roadshow

In week 3, the Sideeffect Roadshow will be visiting to talk to our year 9 and 10 students about Drug and Alcohol Awareness. Sideeffect's program focuses on early intervention and education as the key to harm minimisation. It includes engaging content that can change behaviour and/or prevent behaviour and help students make an informed decision. Former AFL player Chris Waterman is the Director of this not for profit organisation and is passionate about youth early intervention. ## SECONDARY DEPUTY PRINCIPAL - Amanda Biddlestone



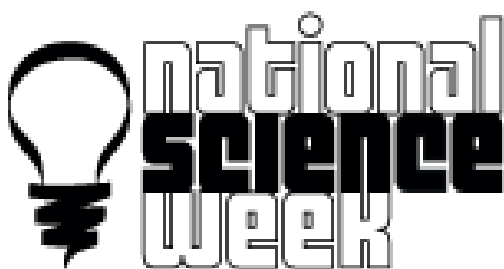

### Dear Parents and Carers

Below you will be able to read about a wonderful program called **Be You** that our school has committed to in order to best foster the ongoing wellbeing of all members of our Learning Community. This letter is designed to inform you and also prepare you for the exciting journey ahead.

As you may or may not be aware, half of all mental health issues emerge before the age of 14 and each year some 15% of 4 – 17 year olds experience some kind of mental health condition. That's one in seven which means an average of six to eight children per year group!

### Our commitment to the Wellbeing of the Donnybrook Learning Community

Donnybrook District High School is committed to improving the mental health and wellbeing of the children, young people, families and staff within our learning community.

We are committed to ensuring every member of our learning community feels a sense of belonging and connectedness.

Our ongoing commitment to continuous and sustainable improvement will be demonstrated through planning, action and review of our progress.

One of the first steps in our journey is to survey parents, students and staff to find out their views on the most pressing issues facing our particular learning community. To this end, we will be sending out via e-mail and Facebook a link to give you all a chance to respond and let us know your thoughts about this huge area of need.

Meanwhile here at school, we would also like to give all students from Year 4 to 10 the chance to share their views by completing a similar survey, so we ask that you contact the school by the end of Week 3 [ Aug 9<sup>th</sup> ] if you do not want your child to participate.

Please note that all survey responses remain anonymous.

### Participation information for parents/carers, children and young people

**What is Be You ?** Our school is participating in a national initiative called "Be You". "Be You" is all about improving the mental health and wellbeing of children and young people in Australia — including yours.

**Why am I being asked to complete this survey?** The educators within your school want to know about your thoughts, ideas and opinions about mental health and wellbeing so they know what's working well in the school and what can be improved.

Educators and families have been invited to complete the survey too, so everyone can have a say.

**There are no right or wrong answers, and no one will be assessed on their results.**

**How long does the Survey take?** It will take you approximately 10-15 minutes to complete.

**Do I have to take the survey?** Completing this anonymous survey is entirely your choice and you can choose not to answer some or all of the questions. Whether or not you decide to participate, the decision is up to you. You can talk with your family or teacher if you're worried about anything.

**How is my privacy protected?** Your privacy is protected because the answers provided by you are completely anonymous and it won't be possible to identify you from your answers. You're never required to submit your name or any other personal detail at any stage of the survey. Data is stored electronically in a password-secured database in accordance with the Privacy Act 1988. Only the Action Team within your school can access summarised survey results, but your personal results can never be identified. Your school will use your feedback for the purposes of identifying and prioritising issues which in turn will guide future planning and lead to continuous improvement.

**What do I need to do to participate?** Be sure to chat with your family about the survey so that everyone is on the same page. Make sure you're comfortable with the information presented in this sheet. If there's anything you don't understand, or if you have questions, please talk with your family or teacher.

If you consent to participate, please complete the survey according to the instructions given by your teacher. Thank you for your support in creating and maintaining a mentally healthy learning community for us all.

***So, now that you have the link, please become an integral part of what we are trying to achieve. With your help and our resources, we can work together to improve the Wellbeing of everyone involved in our wonderful School and its Learning Community. That means you, your children as well as all the staff at DDHS who are so dedicated to making a difference.***
