New Mobile Phone Policy for Term 1, 2020.

This week, the State Government announced a new Student Mobile Phones in Public Schools policy to take effect from the start of Term 1, 2020.

The policy requires all public schools to implement a ban on the use of mobile phones for all students from the time they arrive at school to the end of the school day. This extends to the use of smart watches which need to be on aeroplane mode during this period. The policy aims to reduce distractions in class and improve student engagement.

In the policy, primary students cannot have a mobile phone in their possession. If your child is in Kindergarten to Year 6 and they bring a mobile phone to school, it will be stored until the end of school. If your child is in Years 7 to 10, they are allowed to have their phone in their possession, but must turn it off and keep it out of sight until the end of school.

Exceptions are allowed for students who have approval from me to use a phone to monitor health conditions, or where teachers give students permission to use mobile phones for a specific purpose.

If your child needs to contact you, they can do so through the school's administration. Likewise, if you need to get a message to your child, you can call the school.

Renee and I will now work with staff and the School Board to determine how we will implement this policy and then provide further information to you and the school community.




