New Mobile Phone Policy for Term 1, 2020.

This week, the State Government announced a new Student Mobile Phones in Public Schools policy to take effect from the start of Term 1, 2020.

The policy requires all public schools to implement a ban on the use of mobile phones for all students from the time they arrive at school to the end of the school day. This extends to the use of smart watches which need to be on aeroplane mode during this period. The policy aims to reduce distractions in class and improve student engagement.

In the policy, primary students cannot have a mobile phone in their possession. If your child is in Kindergarten to Year 6 and they bring a mobile phone to school, it will be stored until the end of school. If your child is in Years 7 to 10, they are allowed to have their phone in their possession, but must turn it off and keep it out of sight until the end of school.

Exceptions are allowed for students who have approval from me to use a phone to monitor health conditions, or where teachers give students permission to use mobile phones for a specific purpose.

If your child needs to contact you, they can do so through the school's administration. Likewise, if you need to get a message to your child, you can call the school.

Renee and I will now work with staff and the School Board to determine how we will implement this policy and then provide further information to you and the school community.

convenience. I am aware that this is always eagerly awaited, so as soon as our budgeting is finalised, we will be able to disseminate this information to the school community.

As always we have to take into consideration the academic, behavioural and social and emotional needs of our students. These are the key areas that largely influence how we go about our business.

Year 10s - Pathways to further education

Students are reminded that those who have received an offer letter from TAFE for next year need to log into the student portal and accept the offer. If this is not done by November 8th, your place may be offered to someone else.

For those students who did not get accepted, you may still get a second round offer from TAFE after November 8th or if you have applied to the Trade Training Centre, you may have an option there (though this comes at a cost). You can also still enrol in the General VET Course at Bunbury SHS. Students study a minimum of five General courses and may select a Certificate II course or an Endorsed program from those offered at the school. Certificate II in Business and Skills for Work are options available in Bunbury's 2020 handbook.

All students need to be enrolled in school, TAFE, apprenticeship or full time employment in 2020. This term we need to refer those students who are not enrolled to Attendance and Participation. Please ring us if you require help with this.

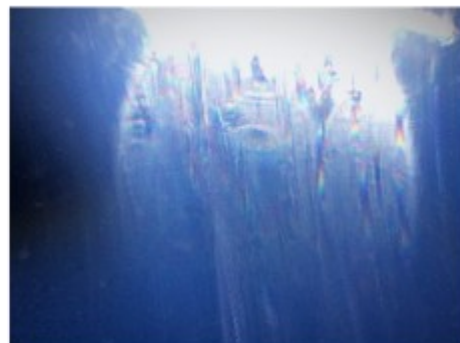
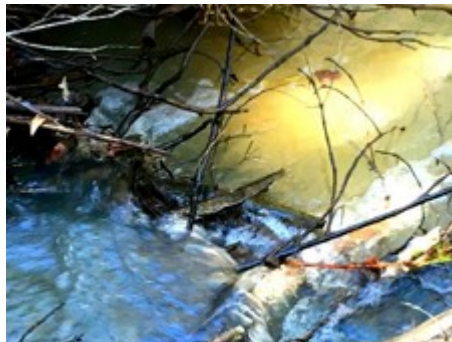
Digital Media Term 3

The first a set of Instagram style images for promotion of the school.

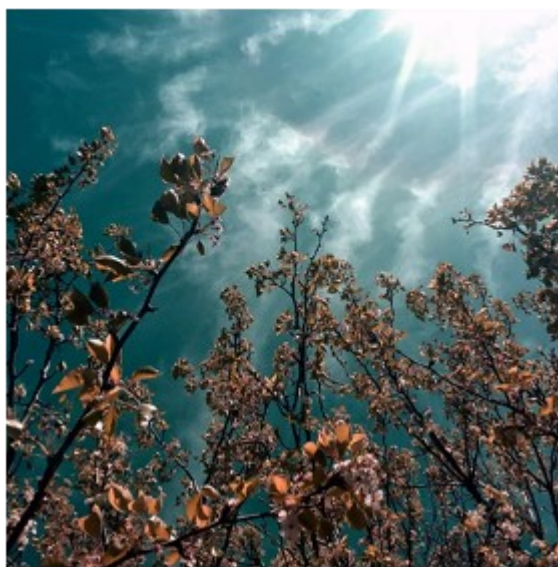
