# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT James Milne

The teachers and education assistants worked extremely hard to make certain the teaching and learning they delivered, supported the students on their individual education journeys. They are to be commended for the effort they put in to create the conditions that enabled the students to progress, whether they were learning at school or at home. The non-teaching staff also worked conscientiously to support the school community, with the school officers, cleaners and gardeners, all contributing to the running of the school throughout the uncertain times.

I would like to acknowledge the outstanding work of the Leadership Team throughout this period. Renee Reid, Lauren Jones, Amanda Biddlestone, Erin Cartledge and Sarah Bible, stood up magnificently when it was needed, committing themselves to the work that was required to support students, staff and parents and carers. ### Semester 1 Reports

Semester 1 Reports will be emailed out on the Tuesday and Wednesday of Week 10. Parents and carers who require a paper copy, may telephone the Junior or Senior Campus Front Office and request a copy of their child's report to be sent home.

With the regular attendance of many students throughout WA being lower due to COVID-19, the breadth and depth of the curriculum covered by schools throughout Semester 1 may have been reduced. For this reason, schools are not required to include A to E grades on this year's Semester 1 student reports. Some may, however the majority won't be.

Here at Donnybrook District High School we are aware that COVID-19 has impacted upon the momentum of student learning, therefore we felt it was fair to leave the judgement around a student's grade until we are better positioned to make this. For this reason, we have elected not to report A-E grades this semester, instead providing a comment in each Learning Area that reflects the progress of the students.

Importantly schooling has largely returned to normal and our students are engaging in the regular curriculum, minus a few extra-curricula activities such as excursions. Semester 2 reports will reflect this and therefore provide the usual, more detailed information on your child's progress and achievement with A-E grades reported in each Learning Area.

Parents and carers are encouraged to sit down with the students and look closely at the reports, in particular reflecting on the comments made by the teachers and the overall attitude, behaviour and effort being displayed. Parents and carers need to make the time to meet with the teachers if an interview was

requested. If an interview wasn't requested, they are still more than welcome to request a meeting with teachers to discuss the report and associated comments. It is imperative that we work together to address the students areas of need. Interviews can be arranged by contacting the Front Offices or the teachers directly.

I conducted reading assessments with most of the students throughout the school in week 6. The focus of the reading assessment was to see how fluently students could read words or passages, depending on the age of the students. Some of the students amazed me with how fluently they read, and improved dramatically from their assessment last term. This data will be used by teachers and students to set goals to improve their reading fluency. You can assist your child at home by getting them to read aloud regularly. Reading fluently is not just about reading quickly, it is also about accuracy and expression.

### Year 9 and 10 OLNA

Year 9 students will have the opportunity to sit a special round of OLNA to allow for the opportunity to pre-qualify for senior school. The three components of Reading, Writing and Numeracy will be held between Monday 10 August and Thursday 12 August.

Round 2 of the Year 10 OLNA will take place between 31 August and 25 September, specific dates will be confirmed closer to the test dates. Students who passed Round 1 test or pre-qualified from their Year 9 NAPLAN do not have to sit the corresponding tests. Letters will be sent to parents advising if their child is required to sit any tests in Round 2.
