Bravo to you both on your truly deserved victories. Well done to all 48 competitors who showed that Chess is thriving here at Donnybrook Junior Campus.



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GENERAL INFORMATION

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students who are finishing Year 6 are eligible for ABSTUDY from the start of secondary school. Their parents and guardians should claim ABSTUDY now as it may help with the cost of school materials, school fees, boarding fees and travel.

ABSTUDY is a group of payments that can help students from secondary school right through to tertiary studies. There are ABSTUDY payments for parents whose children live at home as well as away from home.

Parents can claim now for their child starting Year 7 in 2022. It's especially important parents claim early if their children are moving away from home to study. Claiming before the end of the year will put them in the best position to have their claims finalised and get travel organised so their child is ready to start high school on time.

Are you please able to assist us in getting this message about claiming ABSTUDY now out to parents through primary schools?

The ABSTUDY Resources eKit has resources that can help families work out what payments they're eligible for. It also has social media tiles that can be shared on your channels. It's available from the Services Australia website at servicesaustralia.gov.au/abstudyresources.
