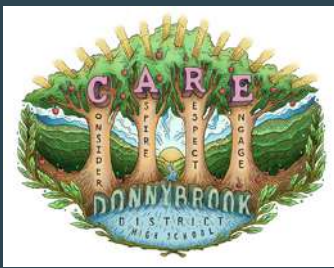

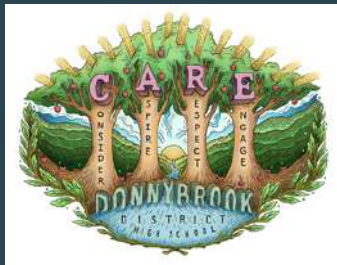
2023 Structure and Programs

Our focus on supporting Donnybrook District High School students' Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) will be enhanced as we adopt a framework that supports staff to integrate SEL throughout the school's academic programs, across the broader contexts of school wide practices and policies, and through ongoing collaboration with families and community organisations.

The Secondary students will be further supported through the development of individual student profiles that will guide their education and career pathways and the curriculum and learning opportunities they engage with. As we elevate the voice of our students, they will be provided with increasing control over their learning, with parents and carers working closer with the school and their child to tailor our offerings to meet individual aspirations.

Secondary specialists will provide support to Primary students in key learning areas including Maths and Science. With the expertise of our High School teachers, our Upper Primary students will be exposed to Creative and Critical Thinking projects that incorporate Digital Technology and Visual Arts.

Our Junior and Middle Primary students will continue to benefit from a strong evidence-based Literacy intervention program, with a complementary Numeracy program currently being explored.

2023 is shaping up superbly, with the direction the school is taking sure to excite our community and importantly address our areas of need.

To support our planning I ask that you please notify the school if your child/ren won't be attending Donnybrook District High School next year. This information is crucial in our current educational environment whereby the school is funded through a Student Centred Funding Model which entails a \$ amount per student enrolled.

Voluntary Contributions

As we enter the second half of the 2023 school year, I will be arranging for statements to be sent home asking parents and carers to pay their outstanding voluntary contributions and/or charges.

Donnybrook District High School relies on parents and carers to contribute towards their child's schooling to be able to continue to offer the opportunities that are being presented to the students from Kindergarten to Year 10. As part of our financial planning each year we budget to receive voluntary contributions together with all outstanding charges. With these funds, we are able to deliver the programs and supply the resources that ensure the students of our community are provided with an array of opportunities during their schooling at Donnybrook District High School.

What we deliver at Donnybrook District High School is unique and (no other K-10 school has the capacity to do what we do) and we are not only looking to sustain this, but importantly build on it in the years to come through some of the programs outlined above.

Mindful Education

Parents and carers may have heard that we are running weekly workshops with students in Mindful Education. We have carefully chosen the acronym of ME for Mindful Education as we want to emphasise this initiative is about the individual student and their learning.

The information that is gathered through the Mindful Education lessons and the student reflections are used by staff to develop individual profiles for each student. Information within the student profiles include interest, hobbies, future goals and aspirations. The intent is these will be used to provide a sense of direction and give students a sense of voice in their education.

These profiles can also be used in tailoring learning for students by identifying areas of interest and strength. Part of this also involves developing critical thinking skills.

AdventureWorks

The school has engaged an external provider (AdventureWorks) to provide a Rite of Passage to Adulthood initiative. These lessons will begin in Year 5 and develop throughout each student's secondary education. We aim to support young people to become more connected to who they are, what they value and the kind of life they want to lead. The components of the Rite of Passage to Adulthood complements our Mindful Education lessons and individual student profiles.

We recognise each child's journey to adulthood is changing and the pathway has become increasingly challenging. We intend to tailor activities to suit our students, and in doing so provide opportunities for them to learn, change and achieve their potential.

OLNA

In Week 7 our students will be participating in OLNA testing. The OLNA enables students to successfully meet the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) requirement of demonstrating a minimum standard of literacy (reading and writing) and numeracy. The standard requires students to demonstrate proficiency in using a range of Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF) Level 3 skills in each component.

All things beautiful are fragile are breakable like a petal aside a red-hot fire.

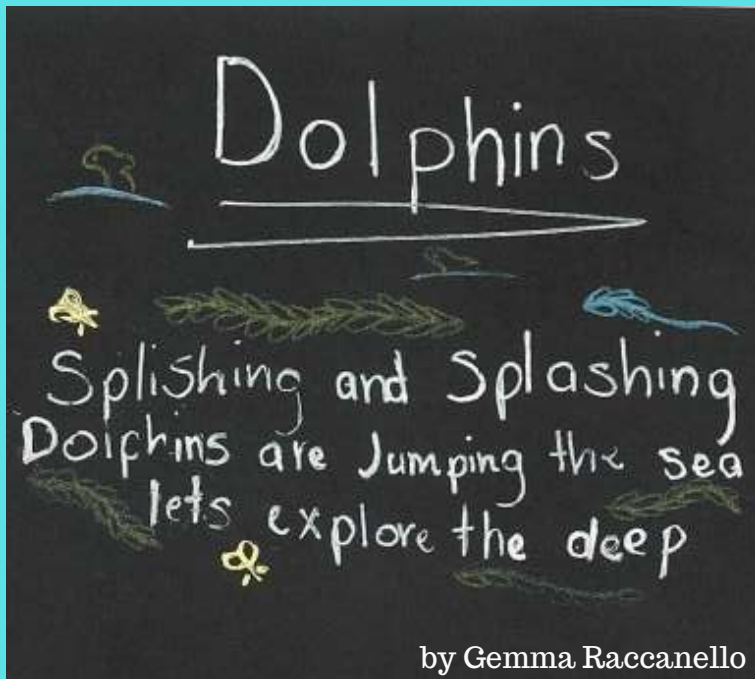
Yet....
