Welcome to 2023. It has been a very busy start at the Senior Campus, however, the students have settled back into classrooms for the new school year. Mrs Brown and Miss McLoughlin would like to welcome our new staff, Ms Elicia McKenna teaching HaSS and Drama, Mrs Jen Townsend teaching Science and YES, Rebekah Brady teaching Macqlit and Mrs Leanne Oliver assisting in the Year 9 class this term.

#### **Mindful Education**

All secondary students have one period a week scheduled to participate in a Mindful Education lesson. Students have this opportunity to work with a consistent teacher to create a safe and supportive environment where curriculum is not the focus. The main focus is on supporting the student's Social



and Emotional learning. In these lessons, teachers work together to plan a meaningful lesson based around topics that students have asked to discuss. Being a very student-centred learning model, our students have the capability to build trust and respect in an environment in which they can share thoughts and feelings without judgement. It is also a space for students who are generally reserved or quiet to have a voice and to be heard by others. We know that a child can not learn without their emotional needs being met first and we believe through these lessons, alongside our AdventureWorks program, we are building the capacity of our students to become more comfortable in sharing and communicate issues, struggles or positives that are happening in their lives. In the first few weeks our students and teachers have been focusing on connection, feelings and curiosity.

#### Year 6 Options

The Year 6 students have made a great start in their options classes on Wednesday afternoons at the Senior Campus. They are involved in Home Economics, Art, Digital Technologies and D & T.



Year 10 Meetings

Miss McLoughlin is currently conducting parent/carer meetings with all Year 10 parents/carers to discuss their progress so far and how we can plan for students' future beyond DDHS including work experience and their plan for further education or work pathways in 2024.

### YEAR 7/8 ADVENTUREWORKS CAMP

To support our Mindful Education lessons, the Year 7 and 8 students participated in their first AdventureWorks camp. For some students, this was their first time setting up tents, cooking for themselves and washing up using camping facilities. Students were challenged both physically and mentally when they had to complete a variety of activities throughout the 3 days and reflect on their problem solving, teamwork, values and personal attributes.

#### Year 7 Camp

Camp begun with students completing a series of team building activities that focused on their communication and problem solving skills. Throughout each activity students were given the opportunity to debrief with their group and facilitator to improve their designs. Day 2 saw the students design and build their own rafts. Although the rafts had very different success rates, it was amazing to watch the development and improvement in the communication skills between the students. A highlight for the students was the high ropes activity which saw students both physically and mentally challenged to complete a range of different high ropes courses.



#### Year 8 Camp

Camp began a similar way for the Year 8 student. The first activity for the boys was mountain biking, while the girls were tasked with rafting. Despite finding it challenging and out of their comfort zone, students engaged in the activities and the debrief that followed. Once the physical challenges were over for the day, students were tasked with setting up their own tents. Students faced both a physical and mental challenge on Day 2 when tasked with rock climbing and abseiling. Each group developed their own set of values in which they were going to live by for the camp. Once students bought into the values, they received a buff to symbolise their common goals.
