


## Inside the Classrooms at the Senior Campus

As part of our ongoing improvement of Donnybrook DHS's Agriculture facilities, our students have identified the installation of reticulation as one of the first crucial steps to improve crop outcomes.

Students have also been looking at ways to improve the sustainability of our Agriculture program. Harvesting tomato seeds to be used for next season is a great way to make use of over-ripe tomatoes!
