Belinda's smile was infectious, and her humour was incredibly cheeky, creating laughter with ease and bringing joy to those who were around her.



A warm welcome back to Term 2. It certainly is magnificent to see our students back at school and importantly engaged in their learning. The positive start by the majority of our Primary and Secondary students has set the tone for a very productive term. I challenge our students to work hard throughout the remaining 7 weeks and importantly gain the most from the learning opportunities afforded to them. Teachers will be ensuring that the core learning is targeting their needs, whilst complementing this with an array of extra-curricular activities, designed to support their overall development.

Donnybrook District High School's partnership with AdventureWorks is building strongly, with the workshops and camps beginning to impact positively on the development of the students' Social and Emotional Learning competencies, including;

- Self-Management Skills
- Responsible Decision Making
- Relationship Skills
- Social Awareness and
- Self-Awareness

The recent Year 7 Camp provided a unique chance for our students to engage in activities that challenged them as individuals and as a group. The rafting, mountain bike riding and hiking were adventure focused, but importantly complemented by conversations that supported the students to develop their sense of value and sense of belonging, both of which are crucial as they embark on the journey from childhood to adulthood.

Our Year 6-10 Student Leaders have their second Leadership Workshop next week. This workshop will provide these students with an opportunity to put their leadership skills into action as they navigate walking trails within Cape Leeuwin.

All students in Years 5-10 will also participate in in school workshops with the AdventureWorks team in Week 5. These workshops are important for connecting the students with the AdventureWorks facilitators and their peers, knowing success is elevated when strong relationships are formed and maintained.

As a school we are also genuinely excited to offer up a series of 'On Country' learning opportunities for our Year 6-10 Aboriginal students. With the support of Local Elders, the AdventureWorks team, Wendy Mountford and Telicia O'Dine, are coordinating a series of workshops to target social and emotional learning through a culturally appropriate and respectful lens.

The strong focus at Donnybrook District High School is about supporting our young people to acquire and apply the knowledge, skills and attitudes to develop healthy identities, manage emotions, and achieve personal and collective goals. Importantly we want them to feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain supportive relationships, and make responsible and caring decisions.

I'm pleased that our P&C, are also actively looking at avenues to assist parents and carers to support their student's Social and Emotional Learning. This is a positive initiative that has the potential to connect with our efforts to enhance the key competencies outlined above.

I trust parents and carers can see the value in this approach and recognise that we are truly offering up something purposeful and unique for our school community.


Junior Campus Yarning Circle
